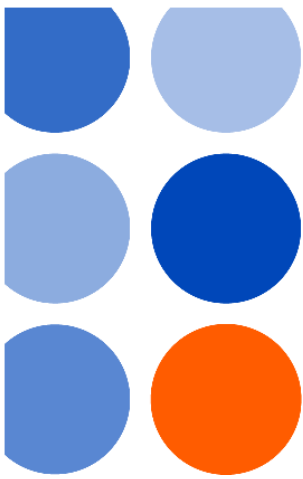
Your Tasks:

The „Hopp Children's Cancer Center at the NCT Heidelberg” (KiTZ) is a joint institution of the German Cancer Research Center (DKFZ), the Heidelberg University Hospital (UKHD) and the University of Heidelberg (UniHD) (<https://www.kitz-heidelberg.de/en/>). As a therapy and research center for oncologic and hematologic diseases in children and adolescents, the KiTZ is committed to scientifically exploring the biology of childhood cancer and to closely linking promising research approaches with patient care– from diagnosis to treatment and aftercare. The KiTZ Translational Pediatric Oncology program focusses on the translation of new research findings into clinical trials. For this purpose, the KiTZ Clinical Trial Unit has been set up.
